REPORTS OF INTERNATIONAL GUESTS

International Vice President Don O'Blenis spoke about the Indiana governor's race, along with unemployment benefits and the right-to-work movement in the state. We need to get our members involved in politics. The National Roofing Industry Pension Fund is doing well.

International Asst. Director of Market Development Frank Wall discussed political issues and also stressed the need to get members involved in local races, such as school boards and town council. We need everyone to fight for our work and be more active in organizing efforts.

International Marketing Representative Fred Gee talked about the ongoing organizing campaign against Zero company and the need to locate all the jobs they are working on. He then discussed Ohio's public service workers and their fight to save collective bargaining and State Bill SB5.

International Representative Mike Stiens discussed problems unions across the country are having. Local 147 in Louisville needs a manager to run day-to-day business with the increase in hours. Kalkreuth Roofing is looking for a foreman.

REPORTS OF DELEGATES
