

Local 4 and Prudential Center: Revitalizing Newark

In November of 2007, Prudential Center ushered in a new era of sports and entertainment in Newark and the entire Northern New Jersey area. Newark is undergoing a major revitalization, converting the city core into a vibrant and energized entertainment district that includes Prudential Center, the New Jersey Performing Arts Center, The Newark Symphony, and Riverfront Stadium. Prudential Center, located just two blocks from Penn Station, will be the cornerstone of the revitalization and renaissance of downtown Newark.

Local 4 Contractor Chosen to Roof Arena

Our very own Local 4, Newark, NJ, Roofers were integral to the construction of this \$375 million project. The arena, which took two years to build, was capped off with 2,700 square feet of a single-ply Firestone roofing system. The installation was done by E.R. Barrett, Inc., one of Local 4's largest contractors. Business Manager Dave Critchley worked closely with owner Malcolm McDonald overseeing the work. E.R. Barrett, Inc. is a proud supporter of the New Jersey Devils renaissance development,

and the roofing, waterproofing and sheet metal contractor is located just one mile from the project so they were able to provide truly local support to the project. Local 4 Journeyman Mike Guerrini was the leader of the ten- to sixteen-man crew that started work in late April, 2007, and completed the final touches in November.

Inside the structure, eight million pounds of structural steel and 25,000 cubic yards of concrete came together to form an 850,000 square foot space that will house 17,625 seats for hockey games, 750 flatscreen televisions, a 350-seat restaurant, 76 luxury suites, five concourses, and two club lounges. Outside, the red and gray exterior, inspired by Newark's bricklaying and railroad heritage, is homage to the colors of the New Jersey Devils.

A 4,800 square foot big screen LED television faces Newark Penn Station, serving as a

focal point for area visitors. The Center, which has already been nicknamed "The Rock" in reference to Prudential's recognizable logo, has become a reality that will change the face of downtown Newark and make it a destination for sports and live entertainment throughout the region.
